(CARLISLE, PA) – Further to its previous announcement of a new Polyisocyanurate (polyiso) insulation plant to be built in Washington State, Carlisle Construction Materials (CCM) now announces more specifically that the plant will be located in the new Randles Business Park, in an unincorporated area of Frederickson, Pierce County, approximately 45 miles south of Seattle. With operations targeted to commence in the third quarter of 2012, this new facility, CCM's seventh polyiso plant, will be built and equipped to the same high standards as CCM's existing polyiso facilities in New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Florida, Texas and Utah.
